The Emergency Assistance Center Annual Report 2022

TEAC offers clients:

- * Seven-day food supply
- * Healthy food options: In addition to nonperishable food items, clients receive milk, eggs, sliced bread and butter, frozen beef and poultry, bakery, and fresh produce
- * Fresh home-grown produce donated by local gardeners
- * Recipes and a menu guide using many staples from the food pantry
- * Hygiene items such as soap, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, laundry detergent and dishwashing liquid, toilet paper, and paper towels
- * Baby items such as diapers and wipes as well as feminine hygiene items
- * Protective Personal Equipment (PPE) face masks, hand sanitizer and wipes
- * Curbside service or in-person shopping at our "choice pantry"
- * Delivery to senior citizens, the disabled and veterans who are unable to drive
- * Clothing for children of all ages
- * Paws On Child Hunger: Weekend food help for qualified Twinsburg students in partnership with Twinsburg City Schools
- * The Ohio Department of Jobs and Family Services on-site twice a month to enroll eligible clients for food, medical or cash assistance.
- * The Veteran's Administration Case Manager is available to see veterans in person
- * Counseling is available through Portage Path Behavioral Health
- * Easter baskets for youngsters through generous donations from area students
- * Birthday bags filled with cake mix, frosting, tablecloths, candles, plates, napkins and party favors to help children celebrate their special day
- * Bags for children that include a new book, stuffed animal and cozy blanket
- * Information about other programs and resources in the area

TEAC Improvements and Achievements:

- * The annual site inspection by The Akron-Canton Regional Food Bank scored TEAC a perfect 100% for Best Practices in all five areas of evaluation
- * Funding from the Akron Community Foundation helped TEAC purchase PPE and fresh food items
- * Funding from Kohl's, A Community With A Heart Program helped purchase food
- * Funding from Hikma Pharmaceuticals helped TEAC provide fresh produce
- * Monthly support from Cuyahoga Valley Church, Plastic Process Equipment and people who donated from their required minimum distribution helped fulfill the TEAC mission
- * Provided meals for veterans at the Northfield VFW
- * Started "Food for a kNIGHT", a food program within Nordonia City Schools
- * TEAC is core member of "Nordonia Hills Community Connection" a group of organizations, who work in collaboration to offer access to resources needed to help individuals gain stability through their adversity
